This is the introductory art course that focuses on experiences creating and responding to art. It is based on the understanding and application of the elements and principles of art. Emphasis will be placed on production, and on forming a value system for art criticism Students will develop understanding and appreciation through creating, writing and, speaking about for a variety of art forms. Students will be challenged to creatively problem solve and think critically about both their own artwork and that of others. Students who successfully complete this course may choose to continue through the Canyon **Fine Arts Career Pathway**.

GRADING

Overall student course grades will be based on class assignments & activities, homework, quizzes, and participation. Projects will be graded on five general criteria: creativity/originality, craftsmanship, effort/use of time, technique/use of materials, and the requirements stated at the beginning of each project. Students must complete a **project reflection** and **self-evaluate** before submitting projects.

CLASSWORK & PROJECTS

The course content requires a high level of self-motivation. Simply "completing" an assignment does not equate to a good grade. Students are expected to creatively apply techniques to complete assignments on time and additional work time outside of class is a reality for this course. Major assignments are accepted late but with grade consequences. **The most common reason for earning poor grades in art is the failure to turn in projects**.

BEHAVIOR & EXPECTATIONS

The art room is a place where you have freedom to be expressive, creative, and share your ideas with others. My number one goal is to create a positive class environment. That said let's discuss some specific classroom policies.

- * **Respect** If I am going over information or another student is talking, put down your work, end your conversation and direct your attention toward the speaker.
- ★ Safety zero tolerance...need I say more.
- * **Cooperation -** If you are asked to move your seat, hand over a phone, put away food, etc please do so without defiance. If you want to discuss the situation please do it after class.
- ★ Language Just because it doesn't offend YOU doesn't mean it won't offend others. Please do not use the terms "gay" or "retarded" as a negative comment. Be sensitive with your word choice in this classroom and life.
- * Food and drinks Eat before you come to class or during brunch.
- * **Phones** Phones must be stored during class. Your phone will be confiscated if it is distracting you or others from completing classwork.
- * **Responsibility** The art room is a communal workspace. You are expected to keep the classroom and supplies in clean and working order.

If these expectations cannot be met, appropriate consequences will be given. Depending on the offense they may include phone calls home, detentions, referrals, or Saturday School assignment. Be safe, be respectful, participate positively in class and you should have a great semester.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Your attendance is essential to your learning and to the education of the class as a whole. Like most teachers, I ask that you warn me ahead of time of any absences. Missed class time due to excessive tardies and absences is frequently a cause for poor grades. Tardies and absences will be documented and reported to administration. Multiple occurrences may result in consequences such as; lunch detention, Saturday school or loss of privileges. Be in class when the bell rings!

*** Students will receive reasonable make up time for assignments after absences. Students who miss more than 15 days from any class during a semester are subject to a failing grade in that class.
